## **External Funding Resources**

The funding resources below are offered by departments outside the O'Neill School or from organizations outside of Indiana University. Please review the information below for eligibility requirements and deadlines. Opportunities specific to international students are highlighted below.

- <u>American Association of University Women (AAUW) International Fellowships</u>
  - > INTERNATIONAL STUDENT FELLOWSHIP OPPORTUNITY
    - Fellowship opportunity for female International students. Must have citizenship in country other than the U.S. or possession of a nonimmigrant visa.
    - Awards \$18,000 for Master's/first professional degree.
    - Deadline: Friday, November 15
- <u>Critical Language Scholarship</u>
  - Intensive overseas language and cultural immersion for students learning critical foreign languages.
  - Deadline: Tuesday, November 19
- <u>American Association of University Women (AAUW) American Fellowships elected Professions</u> <u>Fellowship</u>
  - o Award amounts between \$5,000-\$18,000
  - Deadline: Sunday, December 1
- P.E.O. International Peace Scholarship
  - > INTERNATIONAL STUDENT FELLOWSHIP OPPORTUNITY
    - Fellowship opportunity for female International students.
    - Needs based award, up to \$12,000.
    - Deadline: Sunday, December 15
- Ford Foundation Predoctoral Fellowships
  - Fellowships provide three years of support (annual stipend of \$24,000) for individuals engaged in graduate study leading to a Ph.D. or Sc.D.
  - Deadline: Thursday, December 17
- Dolores Zohrab Liebmann Fund Fellowship
  - Awarded annually and covers tuition plus an \$18,000 stipend. Candidates must demonstrate a need for financial assistance and must be U.S. citizens.
  - Deadline: January 3
    - <u>A note to students on the submission process</u>: Students must contact their department for the internal department deadline, which precedes the January 3<sup>rd</sup> deadline.
- <u>IU Prevention Insights Big Idea Challenge</u>
  - Scholarships up to \$1,000 for proposing new approach or research question/pilot study related to substance use disorder and mental health.
  - Deadline: Tuesday, January 21

- Boren Fellowship (National Security Education Program)
  - Funding for U.S. graduate students to study less commonly taught languages in world regions critical to U.S. interests and underrepresented in study abroad, including Africa, Asia, Central and Eastern Europe, Eurasia, Latin America, and the Middle East.
  - Deadline: Tuesday, January 30
- Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) Fellowship
  - Awarded to students studying less commonly taught languages and cultures considered to be of critical interest to the U.S.
  - \$15,000 stipend plus up to \$18,000 towards tuition
  - Deadline: Friday, January 31
